**POLICE OFFICERS FROM ACROSS VIRGINIA CONVERGE ON
HENRICO COUNTY TO LEARN ABOUT THE NEWEST WEAPON
AGAINST INTERNET-BASED CRIME**

RICHMOND, VA Nearly a hundred police officers from across the state will travel to Henrico County on March 26th to attend a half-day seminar on ICSIS: the Internet Complaint Search and Investigation System. A software application-developed by the National White Collar Crime Center (NW3C), ICSIS is revolutionizing the way law enforcement fights online crime. Using ICSIS, agencies across the country can join forces in a virtual environment, sharing valuable information and statistical data to bring perpetrators to justice.

The seminar will be held on the 2nd floor of the Henrico Police Department's Training Center located in the Public Safety complex off Shrader Road. Media interested in covering the 4-hour event should arrive no later than 8:00AM. Interviews with speakers, presenters and participants can be scheduled between 8:00 AM – 8:30 AM, and 10:00 AM – 10:30 AM.
